CFISD Practicum in Early Learning

Scope and Sequence

Course Description:

Practicum in Early Learning is a field-based course that provides students background knowledge of early childhood development principles as well as principles of effective teaching and training practices. Students in the course work under the joint direction and supervision of both a teacher facilitator and an exemplary industry professional. Students learn to plan and direct individualized instruction and group activities, prepare instructional materials, assist with record keeping, make physical arrangements, and complete other responsibilities of early learning teachers, trainers, paraprofessionals, or other educational personnel.

This course continues the emphasis of laboratory experiences in a preschool setting. In this course, students mentor the Child Guidance students and continue participating in extended learning/teaching experiences with the three and four-year-old children in the preschools located in the high schools. They model ethical behaviors, comply with laws and regulations, and assist in establishing a physically and psychologically healthy environment to inspire client confidence in services provided. The students are expected to produce a professional portfolio. (2 Credits)

- Required prerequisite: Child Guidance
- Satisfies advanced course requirement for Public Services endorsement.
- Educational Aid I certification satisfies the requirement to earn a Performance Acknowledgment.
- Seniors receive CFISD Letter of Intent to Interview upon successful completion of program.
- An application may be required if demand exceeds number of available slots.
- Lab supplies/uniform or fee may be required.
