Student's Planning Guide

- Submit admissions applications no later than December and keep copies of all materials you submit.
- Narrow your list of colleges to between 5 and 10. Find online applications or get a paper application from each. Visit as many as possible.
- Make a master calendar and note:
 - Test dates and registration deadlines
 - College application due dates
 - Required financial aid applications and deadlines
 - Recommendations, transcripts, letters of recommendation, and other necessary materials required for each college
 - Your high school's deadlines for application requests, such as your transcript or letters of recommendation
- Ask for teacher recommendations. Give each person your résumé, a stamped, addressed envelope, and any forms.
- Write application essays and ask teachers, parents, and friends to read first drafts.
- Check your online status or call each college to ensure receipt of all materials.
- Complete and submit the FAFSA and CSS/Financial Aid Profile (if required) as soon as possible after January 1. Apply for as many scholarships as possible.
- You must tell every college of your acceptance or rejection of offers of admission or financial aid by May 1. Send a deposit to the college you choose. Finalize college-housing arrangements, if you plan to live on campus.
- Have your high school send a final transcript to the college you choose to attend.
