* 4 Social Studies credits (must include Geography and/or World History + US History + Government + Economics)

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# - Students take 4 Advanced Placement (AP) or 4 Dual Credit (DC) courses for 4 credits 

(English, Math, Science, Social Studies, LOTE/Foreign Language, \& Fine Arts)

## OR

## Students take a combination of Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Credit (DC) courses for 4 credits

$>$ Advanced Placement (AP)
$>$ Earn college credit by taking the AP exam in the Spring
$>$ Each college or university determines whether or not credit is awarded from their institution
$>$ Dual Credit (DC)
$>$ Earn high school and college credit for a specific high school course through successful completion of the course
$>$ Note: Specific entry requirements must be met before enrolling in DC classes
