(must include English IV)

✤<u>4 Math</u> credits

(must include Algebra I and Geometry)

✤<u>4 Science</u> credits

(must include Biology + Chemistry and/or Physics or AP Physics I)



 A Social Studies credits (must include Geography and/or World History + US History + Government + Economics)



Multidisciplinary Studies

Students take 4 Advanced Placement (AP) or 4 Dual Credit (DC) courses for 4 credits

(English, Math, Science, Social Studies, LOTE/Foreign Language, & Fine Arts)

<u>OR</u>

*<u>Students take a combination of Advanced</u> <u>Placement (AP) and Dual Credit (DC) courses</u> <u>for 4 credits</u>

- Advanced Placement (AP)
 - > Earn college credit by taking the AP exam in the Spring
 - Each college or university determines whether or not credit is awarded from their institution
- Dual Credit (DC)
 - Earn high school and college credit for a specific high school course through successful completion of the course
 - > <u>Note</u>: Specific entry requirements <u>must</u> be met before enrolling in DC classes
