

ADVANCED CLASSES ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY INTO K-LEVEL CLASSES

Language Arts, Science and Social Studies: Students must have an 85 or higher end of the year average in that subject area or earn Masters Level on STAAR. Eligible students will be scheduled into that K-level class. Parents will be notified of the K-level placement and may opt their child out.

Math: Students must meet the above criteria and earn an 80+in the appropriate summer program, or credit by exam


Know: K- level classes move at a **faster pace** and **demand more out of class time** for assignments.

- Students are expected to be <u>independent</u> and <u>self-directed learners</u>.
- These classes are designed to challenge you beyond grade level.
