## Secondary Safety Pledge

Recognizing that every student has the right to a safe environment where everyone is treated with respect:

- I understand that I have an essential role in school safety and violence prevention.
- I will respect and maintain personal space of others.
- I will not bully, tease or hurt anyone. If I hear or see bullying/cyberbullying or teasing, I will tell the person to stop and report it to an adult.
- I will immediately report any threats of violence, suicide, presence of weapons, explosives or drugs to school administrators, allowing them to investigate and determine the seriousness of the report.
- I will do all I can to stop harassment of others.
- I will promote the acceptance of individual differences, recognizing that diversity contributes to the strength of my school.



Cy-Fair Tipline is an anonymous reporting system that allows students and parents to communicate school concerns or threats to their campus administration through the internet or the tipline application. Students and parents are able to submit reports/tips anonymously 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.



# Attendance



Come to school every day.

Texas State law = Attend school 90% of all school days

Aug. - Dec = 8 absences

If absent:

- Bring notes to attendance office
- Parents can email notes to the attendance office

Letters are mailed when you have too many absences.

Students must make up the time that is missed before or after school.

Cakes, cookies, balloons for birthdays are not permitted in school. These items will be kept in the AP office.



# SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS

# Bus Conduct

- Scan badges when entering and exiting
- Follow bus driver's directions
- Keep hands, feet, objects to yourself
- ONLY ride your bus – use YOUR bus stop
- There are multiple cameras on all the buses with sound.
- **Buses are a privilege – bus misconduct can cause bus removals.**

# Vaping - New Law


Students in possession of, using, selling, giving, or delivering e-cigarettes on school grounds/school-related events = ALC.

E-cigarette = any part or accessory for the vaping device, not solely the cartridge containing nicotine, THC, or other substances.

# Level I Violations



- Eating/drinking outside of dining hall
  - Squirting water bottles
- Not bringing materials(including Chromebook)
- Refusing to follow classroom rules
- Running/or making noise
- Having/ using nuisance items
- Refusing to follow classroom rules (participating in class, completing work, etc.)
- Sleeping in class
- Talking out
- Tardy





# Nuisance Items

- Teachers can confiscate nuisances items

- Disruption, distraction
- Safety
- Easily stolen

- Nuisance items may include:

- Electronic games
- Wireless speakers
- Hats, sunglasses, chains etc.
- Toys
- Hoodies

# Level I - Tardies

**7:45**

**School starts  
at 7:45 AM**

How to avoid 1st period tardies:

- ~Spillane opens at 7:00 AM
- ~Ride the bus rather than being a car rider

Ways to avoid tardies during the school day:

- ~Ask permission from teacher to use restroom before going
- ~Avoid talking too long in the hallway
- ~If a teacher stops you or holds you, get a pass.





# Tardy Corrective Actions

**Tardy #1 - #6 = Lunch Detention**

**Tardy #7- #10 = D-hall after school**

**Tardy #11 and above – DMC (in school suspension), parent escort, staff escort, or other options**





# Level I - Nuisance Items

## EAR BUDS/HEADPHONES



- Earbuds/headphones are considered nuisance items.
- Earbuds/headphones in after 7:25 AM = confiscation
- Kept in AP office for 1 week.

***No Fee & Picked up by student after 1 week.***





# Level II Violations- BADGES



- ★ ID Badges must be worn ALL day
  - **GRADE COLORED** solid lanyard, around your neck
  - NOT clipped on pocket or backpack
  - **NOT around your neck = not wearing badge**

- ★ If you lose your badge, \$5 for a replacement
  - GO TO THE BADGE STATION
    - Order a new one 7:25 – 7:45 AM





# Level II Violations- BADGES

- Students should report to AP office immediately.





# Level II Violations

- ★ Skipping class
- ★ Throwing objects that could harm
- ★ Selling items without permission of AP or Principal
- ★ Hugging, kissing, holding hands (PDA – Public Displays of Affection)





# Level II Violations

- ★ Dining hall misconduct
- ★ **Restroom misconduct**
- ★ Refusal to follow requests of school staff





# Level II - Device Policy



**NO PHONES 7:25-3:10**

- ~Turned off and put away (*not vibrate/silent mode*)
- ~Teachers can give you permission
- ~Using phone without permission = confiscation  
(THIS INCLUDES THE HALLWAYS)




# Level II Offense - Cheating

- Sharing answers when it is not a group assignment
- Looking up answers during a test
- Copying someone else's work (EVEN AT LUNCH)
- Telling the answers to a quiz or test
- Copying a book jacket for your book report
- Taking photos of tests/assignments
- Sending photos of assignments
- **Dishonesty = GRADE OF "0"**
  - **Cannot redo the 0**





# Level III Violations

- ★ **Bullying**
- ★ **Online Harassment**
- ★ **Disrespectful towards adults**
- ★ **Physical contact resulting in injury**
- ★ **Fighting - where the person cannot get away**
- ★ **Lying during investigation or giving false tip**
- ★ **Misuse of Chromebook, district network**
- ★ **Medication violation (all medications must go to the nurse)**





# CFISD MEDICATION POLICY

- Students cannot be in possession of any medication.
- Parents must transport all medication to and from school.



*Violation of medication policy = Level III Offense*





# Level III - Serious

- ★ **Disrespect towards staff**
- ★ Anything that has the appearance of a weapon
- ★ **Theft**
- ★ **Vandalism**
- ★ **Tobacco, cigarettes**
- ★ Possessing anything that could cause harm:
  - fireworks, taser, snappers, etc.





# Level III - Racial/Offensive Language

Using profane, obscene, indecent remarks, or racially/ethnically offensive language and/or gestures



Will result in immediate consequences





# Level III- Drama Disruption

Rumors and gossip are not okay

Online - Commenting, Messaging

Negative Group Messaging


Drama- "Someone said that you said that she said..."

Stirring people to fight

Threats in person or online

Doing anything of this nature = you are not "safe" with other students

Immediate correction/DMC



Be free of the complexities of drama.  
Be free of those who live it and those who share it.






# Level IV Violations

- Assault
- Controlled substance/dangerous drug
- Alcohol
- Terroristic threat
- Retaliation

- ★ Limited lunch options


### Common Offenses:
