BUILDING YOUR PORTFOLIO The Visual Arts Path:

Having a passion for art and creativity is a great starting point for pursuing a major in the creative field.





1.EDUCATION BACKGROUND:

- Foundational Art Classes: Taking a variety of foundational art classes in high school builds a diverse range of artwork in your portfolio, showcasing proficiency in different mediums, styles, and subject matters.
- Advanced Placement (AP) Studio Art Courses: These courses offer a more rigorous curriculum and provide an opportunity to create a portfolio for college credit.
- **Digital Art and Technology:** There is a growing importance of digital art and technology. Students need more experience in this field.
- Art History: Take AP or Dual Credit Art History to develop an understanding of various art movements and styles. This knowledge can enrich your artistic perspective.









TAKE HIGH SCHOOL ART COURSES:



Suggested Course Sequence:

Choosing two foundational art strands post-Art I is vital for skill growth and a robust college art portfolio. For example, progression might look like 9th grade: Art I Photography, 10th grade: Art II Photo, 11th grade: Art II Digital Art, and 12th grade: AP 2D (digital art or photo) + 1 AP or DC Art History, ensuring students earn 2 college art credits before graduation.

Participation in art-related organizations and workshops helps gain real-world experiences and opportunities to learn from professionals.




Internships and Workshops:

COLLEGE AUDITIONS:

- Auditioning starts as early as October
- Get your audition solo choreographed early to eliminate stress. Recommend summer before your senior.
- Read the audition requirements carefully.
- Demonstration of willingness to learn is as important, if not more important than current skill. Take direction!
