Course Description:

In Architectural Design II, students will gain advanced knowledge and skills needed to enter a career in architecture or construction or prepare a foundation toward a postsecondary degree in architecture, construction science, drafting, interior design, or landscape architecture. Architectural Design II includes the advanced knowledge of the design, design history, techniques, and tools related to the production of drawings, renderings, and scaled models for commercial or residential architectural purposes. (2 Credits)

Students in this class are eligible to apply for PLA (Prior Learning Assessment) credit through Lone star college to earn credits toward an associate degree in Architectural design.
