CFISD Introduction to Cosmetology

Scope and Sequence

Course Description:

This exploratory course is highly recommended for students who are interested in a career in cosmetology; it also assists students who have an interest but are unsure this is the career path they wish to follow. Learners explore areas such as bacteriology, sterilization and sanitation, hair styling, manicuring, shampooing, as well as the principles of hair cutting, hair coloring, skin care, and facial makeup. Connected to this is the study of careers in the personal care services industry. To be successful in this profession, students should possess skills/aptitudes relative to the industry, as well as academic knowledge and motivation. Attendance is critical to the earning of the 1000 clock hours of supervised classroom instruction and demonstration needed before students qualify to take the state board test for licensing. Students in this course may begin to earn clock hours toward state licensing requirements. (1 credit)

- Seniors must be concurrently enrolled in Cosmetology II
- Students may opt to purchase lab kit and/or uniform
- \$25 permit fee is required, and MUST be paid within 7 days of enrollment to remain in the class if this is a student's first course in cosmetology
