Course Description:

Principles of Human Services is a year-long course that is offered to 7th and 8th grade students to explore careers related to people's personal and family needs. Information and skill development will focus on early childhood development, services for families & community, personal care, nutrition and wellness, apparel construction and interior design. Development of personal characteristics for success in all careers along with hands-on experiences in the cooking and sewing labs will also be included. Students begin exploring the public services endorsement and are introduced to the following CFISD courses: Lifetime Nutrition & Wellness, Interpersonal Studies, Education & Training, Child Development, Child Guidance and Intro to Cosmetology. (1 High School credit)
