Dear CFISD Community,

The two-week early voting period for the Nov. 3 general election begins **Tuesday**, **Oct. 13** and will continue through **Sunday**, **Oct. 30**. I encourage you to make your voice heard by casting your vote either at an early voting site or any Election Day polling center.

Harris County Clerk Chris Hollins's website, <u>harrisvotes.com</u>, has many good resources to prepare you for election season. You can even review a <u>sample ballot</u> by entering your name and address, so you can learn more about the candidates running for office. Elections closer to where we live have a greater impact on our lives. I encourage you to research the candidates and express your constitutional right to vote for the person you choose.

Early voting hours of operation are scheduled as follows:

- Oct. 13-17 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.;
- Oct. 18 noon to 7 p.m.;
- Oct. 19-24 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.;
- Oct. 25 noon to 7 p.m.;
- Oct. 26 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.;
- Oct. 27-29* 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.; and
- Oct. 30 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- ISGH Bear Creek Community Center (17250 Coventry Park Drive, Houston, 77084);
- Lone Star College Cypress Center (19710 Clay Road, Katy, 77449); and
- Katherine Tyra Branch Library (16719 Clay Road, Houston, 77084).

I strongly recommend that you take advantage of the enhanced early voting opportunities in 2020. Many of our schools are designated as Election Day polling locations, and voting early will help reduce heavy traffic at CFISD campuses.
